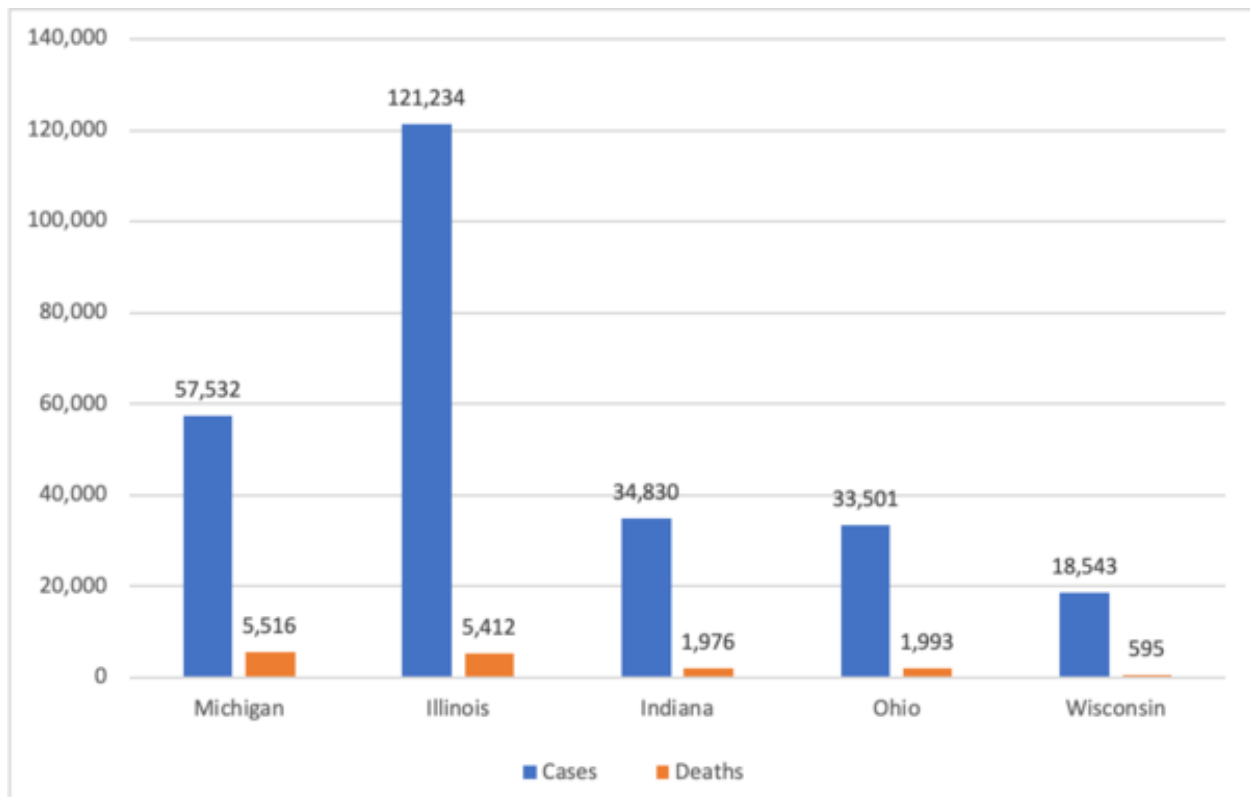

Governor Gretchen Whitmer issued three new Executive Orders (hyperlinks below with recent EOs):

- **Executive Order 2020-108** - Maintains restrictions to health care and residential facilities through June 26.

- **Executive Order 2020-109** - Extends the face mask requirement, the requirement for grocery stores and pharmacies to provide shopping time for vulnerable populations, and notification of employees when one employee has tested positive for the virus through June 12.
- **Executive Order 2020-110** - Rescinds the Safer at Home order, moves the entire state to Phase 4 of the MI Safe State Plan.



Stay at Home Lifted! In-Person Dining, Retail to Reopen

Through Executive Order, Governor Whitmer rescinded her earlier Safer at Home Order, which had Michigan residents sheltering in place in their homes. Her order moves the entire state to Phase 4 of the MI Safe Start Plan. This allows retailers to reopen on June 4 and restaurants to reopen for in-dining service on June 8. Additionally, effective immediately, groups of 100 or less can gather outdoors with social distancing, in-home services can begin, and office work that can't be done remotely can resume. Despite the changes, Michigan residents must continue to wear face masks when indoors and continue to work from home when possible.
